

Kitamoto Nature Observation Park



Kitamoto Nature Observation Park, which extends over 30ha, is designed as the Urban Ecology Park in Saitama Prefecture. It is also the studying field for the Saitama Nature Study Center. It is playing an important role as the vital base of the ecological network to protect endangered species and effectively conserve nature in Saitama prefecture, as well as creating a place for the residents of our prefecture to relax. The park covers various scenery like woodlands, wetlands and grasslands,

where there are habitats for many wild animals, birds, frogs, insects etc. Approximately 1,700 species of insects and 160 species of wild birds can be found in this park. Get our seasonal guide book, enjoy nature hikes and get close to nature!

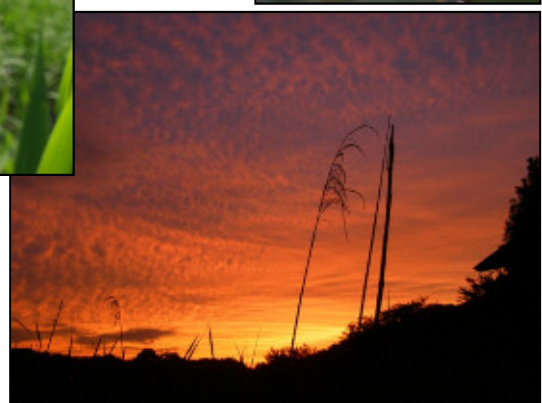
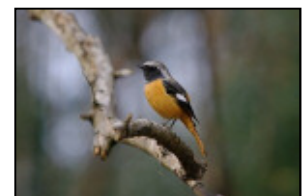

Saitama Nature Study Center

Saitama Nature Study center is located inside the Kitamoto Nature Observation Park. This facility works as a visitor center, and provides you useful information that helps you to deepen your understanding of nature. You may want to come the Nature Study Center first, and then explore the nature in the park. We recommend you to visit the center first of all and then step out into the park. We hope that you will find and experience the nature from another point of view that you haven't expected.

Around the center building we have created a pond and planted alder trees as an example of biotope creation to promote the idea. Access

Our center is located 3.5km away from Kitamoto Station (JR Takasaki Line). From the west exit of the station, it is about 15 min. by bus (Kawagoe-Kanko Bus), or about 45min. on foot. A Parking lot is also available for private cars.

- Releasing wild animals or bringing plants in the park
- Removing wild animals or plants from the park
- Feeding wildlife
- Using products which cause fire or smoke
- Littering
- Trespassing on private property
